



· Adoption by the Spirit

- . Getting our bearings: A Bible overview of the indwelling Spirit in five (and a bit) minutes
 - o Only a few chosen people were indwelt by the Spirit



1 Samuel 16:13 Ezekiel 2:2

o The promise was that one day the Spirit would be available to anyone



Joel 2:28 Ezekiel 36:26 Mark 1:8 o Jesus promised his Spirit to his apostles so that they would be his witnesses



Acts 1:8


John 14:16-17

o At Pentecost the apostles were given the Spirit, enabling them to testify authoritatively about Jesus



John 14: 26, 16:7-8, Acts 2:4-13

 Now, all who believe the apostles' testimony about Jesus are indwelt by His Spirit to live for and speak about Jesus



Acts 2:17-21, 38-39

- 'I wanna be like you'?: Are there Apostles today like in New Testament times?
 - Apostles to be a) eyewitnesses of risen Christ (Acts 1:22, 1 Cor 9:1) and b) personally commissioned by Christ (literally 'sent one'?) who c) spoke with Christ's authority (2 Peter 3:16).
 - o Apostles as gifts from the risen Jesus for the church (Eph 4:10-11)
 - o Apostles (and prophets) as the foundation of the church (Eph 2:20)
 - o Apostles given unique markers (signs, wonders and miracles) (2 Cor 12:12)

What do we learn about what it looks like to be filled with the Spirit? Eph 5:18-21

What reasons are given as to why we should be filled with the Spirit? Eph 5:1-2, 8-13, 15-17

+ I'm glad you asked that...

 If all Christians have every blessing in Christ already and have already been filled with the Spirit, how can we be "more full"?

The issue is not how much of God do I have ("I want more of Him"), but how much of me does God have ("He wants more of me").

 If people receive the Spirit (often with the gift of tongues) after conversion in Acts 2:4 (Pentecost), Acts 8:15-17 (Samaritans), Acts 10:45 (Cornelius), Acts 19 (the Ephesian 12), what's that all about? Isn't that a pattern for the NT church?
