- 1. What does Peter say that Christians already have, v9-10?
- 2. What does he want them to do and what do you think he means by it, v10a? (You might find it helpful to remember the context of v5-9, which also begins 'make every effort'.)
- 3. What will the results be if they don't, v9? (Why is this so bad?)
- 4. What will the results be if they do, v10b-11? (How do the words of v11 make you feel? Why is it such good news for the believer?)
- 5. So if someone asked 'why should I bother trying to grow as a Christian, what would you say if you used Peter's arguments here?'

Keep remembering v12-15

- 6. What are Peter's priorities?
- 7. Why do you think he is so concerned about this?
- 8. Why do you think remembering the things that Peter has talked about are so important, even for established Christians?
- 9. What are his certainties for himself and why (you might like to include verse 11 in this too)?
- 10. How do Peter's certainties about death and the future encourage us?

In what practical ways can we learn to see the past, present and future more clearly?
